The Water Cycle

STAGE 3

The water that is on Earth has been here for billions of years. It was here before the dinosaurs and will probably be here for millions of years to come. This means that any water you drink was probably once dinosaur wee!

Water isn't always a liquid. The water cycle shows the different stages that water goes through on its journey.

Condensation

Evaporated water meets cold air in the sky. This causes it to turn back into tiny water droplets. This is called **condensation**. You can see this happening on a warm window on a cold morning, or when you see your breath in the cold air. This process forms clouds.

Precipitation

<u>Precipitation</u> is the scientific term for water falling from the sky. This is usually in the form of rain, snow or hail. This is the way that water returns to the ground from the sky.

Evaporation

The heat from the sun causes water to <u>evaporate</u>. This turns it into a gas. The gas then rises up into the sky. Water evaporates at any temperature above freezing. It happens a lot quicker at warmer temperatures. That's why clothes dry more quickly in the sun than the shade.

Collection

Water flows downhill. It runs down mountains in rivers and streams. Most

of these end in the oceans. Some water is absorbed underground. This water still makes its way back to the oceans but it takes a lot longer.
