Provide CPD for teachers/staff to ensure	<p>Accredited qualification in Gymnastics, successfully completed by a member of staff. This has led to greater knowledge, competence and confidence in the teaching of gymnastics. This particular member of staff has also supported selected pupils in their preparation for competition.</p> <p>Teachers have also worked alongside specialist coaches in identified sports/activities i.e. handball, cricket.</p>	Change in staffing – ensure new staff members receive appropriate CPD to ensure quality of provision, subject knowledge and sustainability continues.
To provide opportunities for all pupils to participate in competitions	<p>The use of a minibus together with allocated staff has ensured that the school can attend a wide range of competitions and tournaments including, football, netball, hockey, curling, mini-skills, cross country, swimming and gymnastics.</p> <p>Pupils from Reception to Y6 have had the opportunity to compete. Further, the school has also entered inclusion events that ensure all pupils, including those with SEND, have opportunities to take part.</p> <p>The school won the Preston Schools Small School Championship for 2024-2025!</p>	Continue to affiliate to Preston School Sports Competitions, access School Games events as well as Cluster competitions.
To provide a wide range of extra – curricular activities for all.	<p>A wide range of planned extra-curricular activities take place throughout the year, for all pupils.</p> <p>These include: archery, dodgeball, football, netball, cross country, rugby. The clubs are free to parents or, heavily subsidised.</p>	<p>Pupil Voice to determine extra-curricular offer for 2025-2026.</p> <p>Also consider activities to target non-participants.</p>
To provide enrichment opportunities to foster a love of sport and broaden opportunities	Children have participated in a range of activities with specialist coaches for enrichment days i.e. tri golf, cricket, rugby amongst other sports	Continue to make links with local sports groups and offer taster sessions.
Opportunities for pupils to be active	<p>Focus on active break times with sports leaders together with planned active breaks in classrooms.</p> <p>Focus on outdoor learning and use of Forest School area to encourage activity.</p>	Recruit new Sports Leaders for 2025-2026
To provide additional swimming lessons	<p>90% of Y6 pupils can swim a range of strokes effectively -25m competently.</p> <p>100% of Y6 pupils can perform safe self-rescue.</p> <p>All Reception pupils have increased water confidence by attending weekly lessons for a term.</p>	Miss Doxey has previously attended Teacher Swimming training using the PE grant. This has ensured that we can continue to provide Top-Up Swimming lessons and sessions for EYFS pupils.
